ATTESTATION & CERTIFICATION

As the authorized representative of the entities applying for funding, each entity attests and agrees to the following conditions:

- The funding received through this program will not duplicate or supplant funds received through other programs or initiatives, or other federal, state, or local funding sources.
- The funding received through this program must not supplant funding provided for the state's Department of Corrections (DOC) for the purchase of technology for state prisons, county jails, and youth correction facilities.
- Funds from this initiative may only be spent on permissible uses of funds as documented in program guidance and this application.
- The entity will respond to general inquiries from DHCS and the TPA pertaining to this initiative within one business day of receipt, and provide requested information within five business days, unless an alternate timeline is approved or determined necessary by DHCS. Entities that fail to meaningfully engage with DHCS and the TPA in response to these inquiries may be:
- Subject to audit, and if necessary, recoupment of grant funding by DHCS to ensure adequate documentation, application, and reporting of permissible expenditures; and/or
- Precluded from receiving additional PATH funding.
- The entity is required to alert DHCS and the TPA if circumstances prevent them from carrying out activities described in this program application. In such cases, the entity may be required to return unused funds to DHCS contingent upon the circumstances.
- The entity agrees to submit an implementation plan to the TPA no more than 180 days (about 6 months) after initial funding is received, or March 31, 2024, whichever comes first.

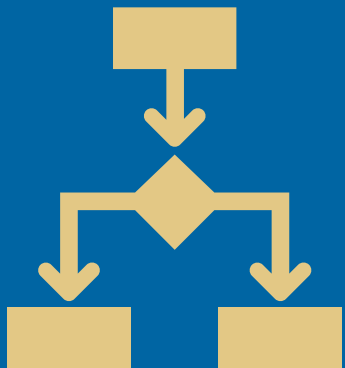

PATH JI ROUND 3: GUARDRAILS FOR SUPPORTING STAFF SALARIES

- »» Funding for directly pertinent portion of FTE only
- »» Salaries must be reasonable relative to similar positions within region
- »» Fringe benefits may be included
- »» Up to 5% additional funding available for indirect costs
- »» Salary support is capped for correctional facilities
 - »» New positions: 18 months max
 - »» Existing positions: 12 months max

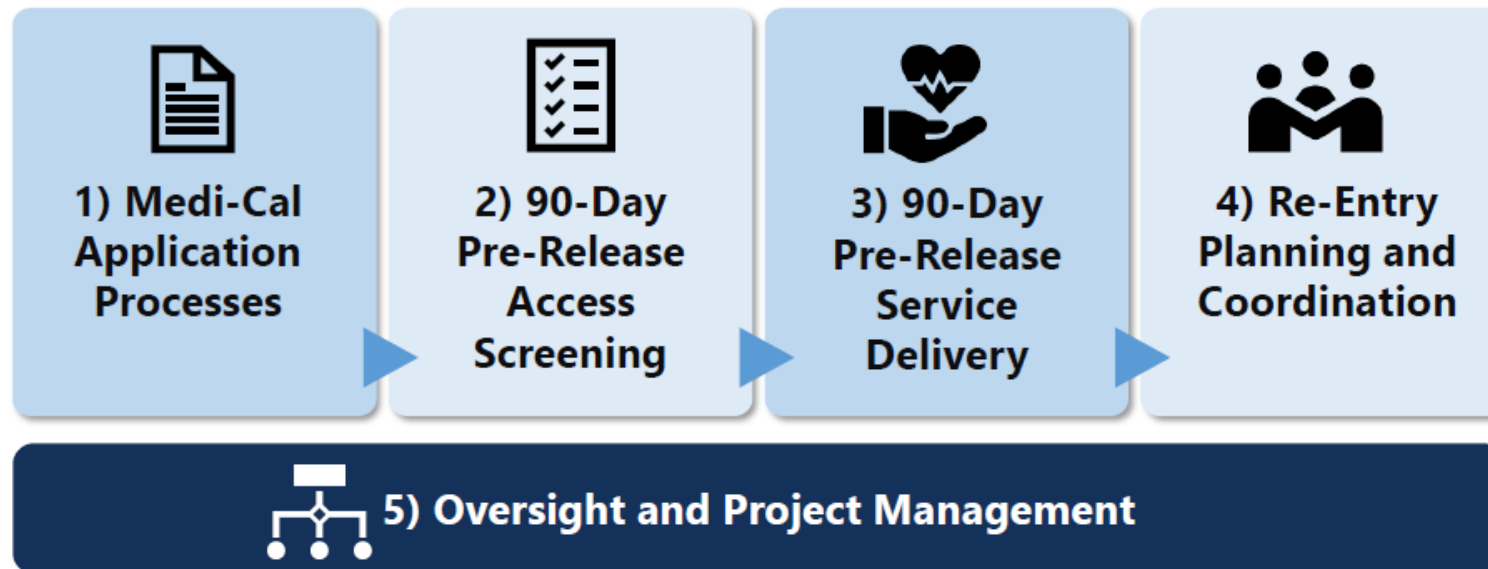
OPERATIONAL EXPECTATIONS & READINESS ASSESSMENT



PATH JI ROUND 3: OPERATIONAL EXPECTATIONS FOR CORRECTIONAL AGENCIES

- Go-live for 90-day pre-release services is no sooner than April 1, 2024 and no later than March 31, 2026
- Readiness assessments must be submitted at least five months before go-live

DHCS will launch a readiness assessment process that will focus on five key areas needed to operationalize 90-day pre-release services:

Readiness Assessment Scoring Rubric

 Pass	Response is complete and indicates total or almost total readiness in the focus area.
 Conditional Pass	Response is complete and indicates partial readiness with a defined plan to achieve readiness by or shortly after the go live date.
 Fail	Response is incomplete , the provided response did not sufficiently address the question, or the provided response did not indicate readiness or define a plan to achieve readiness by or shortly after the go live date.

PATH JI ROUND 3: OPERATIONAL EXPECTATIONS FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AGENCIES

- Go-live for behavioral health linkages is April 1, 2024 (except Professional-to-Professional Clinical Handoff)
- Go live for pre-release services is based on correctional agency launch date(s)



Entities are expected to meet operational criteria regardless of whether they seek PATH JI Round 3 funding

**Minimum Requirement*

COUNTY IMPACT

- » 90-day pre-release services and BH linkages are considered a mandate
- » Services reimbursable to Medi-Cal (first in nation)
 - » New services: not previously provided by carceral settings
 - » Existing services: previously provided by carceral settings
 - » To the extent services are covered that were previously provided or paid by the carceral facility, the state must reinvest all new federal dollars
- » Draft Policy & Operational Guidance expected early June

FUNDING DISTRIBUTION & PROGRESS REPORTING



PATH JI ROUND 3: FUNDING DISTRIBUTION AND PROGRESS REPORTING

1. Application Approval

- 10% of max funding within 90 days of approval

2. Implementation Plan Approval

- 60% of requested funding upon approval

3. Interim Progress Report Approval

- Submitted once 50% of operational criteria are successfully implemented
- 15% of requested funding upon approval

4. Final Progress Report Approval

- Submitted once 100% of operational criteria are successfully implemented
- 15% of requested funding upon approval
